While only ~2% of this amount is reserved for walking and bicycling projects, the state Department of Transportation has the option to use larger portions of these funds for walking and bicycling projects. While I support more funds for walking and biking, I would like to ensure that funding for east Kauai projects (new south bound lane fronting Coco Palms, new north bound lane between Kapaa roundabout and Kuhio Highway) that increase roadway capacity are secured. I would also like to find ways to obtain more federal and state funds for transit services on east and north shores.

4. The state has a "Complete Streets" law designed to create equality of access for all road users (people walking, biking, driving, and taking transit) by requiring streets to be planned, designed, operated, and maintained to enable safe, convenient and comfortable travel for users of all ages and abilities, regardless of their mode of transportation.
